

Principal's Notes:

Dear parents and friends,
Another week has flown. Once again, I thank you for your on-going hard work and co-operation with the remote learning. The children will continued make progress and maintain a strong connection and commitment to their learning because they are so well supported at home. The teachers have been busy correcting and checking through the first sets of books in readiness for next Friday's change-over of materials. We have never thought a fortnight was such a short period of time but the rush to correct sets of books and prepare the new tasks alongside the daily WebEx, Seesaw and on-site supervision makes for an extremely hectic time. I wish to thank all the staff for their good humour and hard work during this period of time. They have all been very accommodating and generous with their time and commitment during such a challenging period.


We are advising parents and carers that temperature checks are being conducted on students when they arrive at school for on-site learning.

Our daily numbers of children on-site fluctuate greatly day-by-day, with anywhere from two to twelve this week. Thank you to all families for adhering to the government's message that all children who can learn from home should do so. We are grateful that all on-site attendance forms are being sent through as early as possible. I am required to reduce staffing at school where possible, so the early receipt of the forms allows me to organise adequate staffing in advance. Students attending school complete exactly the same tasks and presentations as the pupils working remotely. Below are the guidelines for on-site students, taken from the most recent DET Operations Guide:

Regional Victoria

On-site supervision is available for students in the following categories, based on revised criteria:

- *children whose parents and carers cannot work from home and where no other arrangements can be made*
- *Where there are two parents/ carers, both must be working outside the home for their children to be eligible for on-site provision.*

“A Rural Tradition of Excellence”

Monday 3rd August, 2020

Dear families,

Yesterday, the Victorian Government announced that, on the advice of the Victorian Chief Health Officer, regional and rural Victoria will move to Stage 3 restrictions.

These requirements apply to all schools across rural and regional Victoria.

The changes to schools' operations will come into effect from Wednesday 5 August, following a student free day on Tuesday 4 August, and are likely to apply until the end of Term 3.

As outlined in the Chief Health Officer's advice on Friday, schools remain safe places for staff and students – but these steps are critical measures to reduce the movement of students and families across the state.

There are implications for our school, and for families in our school community.

RURAL AND REGIONAL VICTORIA

- Primary school students will move to remote and flexible learning.
- On-site supervision in rural and regional Victoria will be available to:
 - Children whose parents cannot work from home – the same rules as per term 2
 - Vulnerable children

STAFFING

- Schools will ensure sufficient staff are available for necessary on site supervision.
- Staff not required for on-site supervision will work from home.

CAVENDISH PRIMARY SCHOOL TIMELINE

TUESDAY, 4th AUGUST

- **PUPIL-FREE DAY FOR ALL SCHOOLS IN VICTORIA**
- **FROM 12 NOON** If possible, families can bring students to school for a short visit. The children can come into their classrooms to collect necessary pencil cases, recorders, readers, and any other essential items for learning at home. Supplies (books and worksheets) will be placed in

- the outside bag lockers for collection. Copies of all Seesaw, Mathletics, Epic, etc codes will be also included.
- Families requiring the loan of a laptop or iPad can collect these during this visit. The children can take the device to the family vehicle and the parent can sign the loan form.
- Work will be provided for the period Wednesday 5th August until Friday 14th August in the first batch.

WEDNESDAY, 5th AUGUST

- Remote learning commences. We plan to follow a similar program to last time.
- For daily attendance purposes, we need evidence of their engagement in learning. The simplest way is to complete or post a photo of a task on Seesaw.
- The children are expected to attend their daily WebEx meeting if possible – Miss Purnell 9.15am; Ms Ferrier 10.00am; Mr. Hill 10.30am

DATES FOR NEW LEARNING SUPPLIES

- The dates for each fortnight of learning supplies will be:
 - 1st round (supplies available from 4th August) - 3rd to 14th August
 - 2nd round (supplies available from 14th August) – 17th to 28th August
 - 3rd round (supplies available from 28th August) – 31st Aug to 11th Sept
 - 4th round (supplies available from 11th Sept) – 14th to 18th Sept

TIPS FOR FAMILIES:

- **STICK TO THE TIME ALLOCATIONS – DON'T TRY TO DO TOO MUCH. DO AS MUCH OF THE SET WORK AS POSSIBLE WITHIN THE TIME – THEN STOP. SOME CHILDREN ARE QUICK WITH THEIR WORK AND SOME ARE SLOWER – WE UNDERSTAND.**
 - **YEARS 3/6 - literacy: 45-60 minutes, numeracy: 30-45 minutes, physical activities: 30 minutes, additional curriculum areas: up to 90 minutes.**
 - **YEARS F/2 - literacy: 45-60 minutes, numeracy: 30-45 minutes, physical activities: 30 minutes, additional curriculum areas: 30 minutes.**
- **Mental health is crucial. Allow plenty of down time for non-school activities.**
- **We use WebEx mainly for social connection with the class. Seesaw is used for more detailed instruction (videos) and supports the learning packs. WebEx connections can be**

- difficult at times. If you have troubles, send a text to the class teacher to explain. We understand the challenges.


Battery Drive

Please ask your friends, family & any farmers you know, if they have any old batteries they are willing to donate to Cavendish PS.




