



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


Principal's Notes:

Surely you agree with me now.







YOUNG AGE

Ned Kelly was born in Beveridge Victoria in June 1855.

Ned Kelly was born Edward Kelly, he was the eldest son third child of eight children

When Ned was nine his parents moved the family North to a farm at Avenel.

After Ned's father passed away his mother moved to Greta, which was closer to her family, they later moved to a farm at Eleven Mile Creek.

GREEN SASH

When Ned was nine he saved a young boy Richard Shelton from drowning in the Hughes Creek.

The parent of Richard owned the Royal Mail Hotel presented Ned with the Green Sash for bravery.

Ned wore the Green Sash under his armour, he was wearing it when he was wounded at Glenrowan.

CRIME

Ned was in trouble with the law from the young age of 14 years old when he was arrested for stealing money from a Chinese man, there wasn't enough proof and he was set free, about a year later he was arrested for helping bushranger Harry Powers to rob people, for this he spent seven weeks in Kynton gaol.

Ned got into a fight with a hawker (traveling salesman) he was sent to Beechworth gaol for assault and being rude to a lady, he spent five months there.

At age 16 Ned was arrested for horse stealing. He had borrowed the horse from his friend Isiah 'Wild' Wright who had stolen the horse. This time there was a fight with Constable Hall who tried to shoot Ned three times but his gun jammed, Hall then hit Ned over the head with the gun, for this crime Ned was sent to Pentridge Gaol, four months later he was moved to the prison ship the Sacramento, at Williamstown.

In 1877 Ned was again arrested this time at Benalla for being drunk and riding on the footpath, he resisted arrest then ran into a boot shop and locked the door to hide. Ned gave himself up when the judge came to the shop

FITZPATRICK INCIDENT

In 1879 Constable Fitzpatrick went to the Kelly's house to arrest Ned's brother Dan for horse stealing, this is when it is said that Dan refused to go back to the police station and the police officer then tried to get Kate who was only fifteen to sit on his knee for a kiss, it is reported that at this stage Ned shot him in the wrist and Ellen Ned's mother hit him over the head with a shovel. Ellen was arrested for attempted murder and sentenced to three years in gaol, she also had to take her baby Alice (King, from her second marriage) with her. Bill Skilling (Skillion) and Bill 'Bricky' Williamson were also sentenced for six years.

Ned and Dan went into hiding, this is when Joe Byrne and Steve Hart joined the Gang.



STRINGYBARK CREEK

Ned, Dan, Joe and Steve went to Bullock Creek they were hoping that they could raise enough money for their Mother Ellen's appeal, they were running a whiskey distillery.

The Gang were told that there were police that were going to track them down, but before they could track the Kelly brothers down Ned tracked two police to Stringybark Creek where they had set up camp. Thomas Lonigan and Thomas McIntyre, were around the camp fire when Ned and Dan went into the camp they were going to capture them and take their guns.

Constable McIntyre put his hands in the air but Constable Lonigan pulled his gun on the Kelly Brothers so Ned shot him, when Michael Kennedy and Michael Scanlon returned to the camp McIntyre told them to surrender but they didn't and in the end they were both shot, Ned did place Kennedy's coat over his body, McIntyre escaped and went back to Mansfield to tell everybody what had happened.

In October 1878 the Kelly Gang were 'OUTLAWS' as the Government had passed the law stating this.



A reward was to be paid to anyone that could capture them, \$500 for one member or \$2,000 for all four of them. Large groups of police were searching for the Gang.



JERILDERIE LETTER

Before going to Jerilderie, Ned dictated to Joe Byrne, who wrote the more than eight thousand word letter now know as the famous JERILDERIE LETTER, this letter explained why Ned had turned to bushranging in the letter he says about the corruption in the police force, and also the treatment of his family by police.

Ned's words are very colourful, rough and full of metaphors. The letter is full of spelling mistakes, no punctuation.



THE LAST STAND GLENROWAN

Joe's friend Aaron Sherritt was a police spy, so Dan and Joe went to Aaron's house at Woolshed Valley and killed him, the policemen that were supposed to be protecting him hid under the bed and reported the murder the following day. As the Gang knew that the police would send more police to Beechworth by train. Ned and Steve went to Glenrowan on June 27th they took seventy hostages, they held them at the Glenrowan Inn.

While they waited for the extra police to arrive they made railway workers pull up the track hoping that the train would crash.

They had to wait twenty-four hours longer than they had planned, one hostage a school teacher Thomas Curnow, talked Ned into letting him take his family home, he then ran down the rail line with a lantern covered in his red scarf to stop the train.

The police surrounded the Inn, they fired about 15,000 bullets at the Inn, then they set it on fire, Ned came out wearing his 41.4kg Armour firing at the police bullets bouncing off him when the police worked out the armour covered most of Ned, they aimed for his legs, a wounded Ned was taken to Melbourne Gaol he was treated for his wounds. In the shooting the other Gang members were all killed.

TRIAL, DEATH AND BURIAL



While in the hospital wing of the gaol Ned's Mother Ellen was allowed to visit him.

Many people didn't agree with Ned's death sentence, so many that 60,000 people signed a letter stating that he should not be hung.

The jury found Ned guilty of murder, Judge Redmond Barry sentenced Ned to death by Hanging, this sentence was carried out on the 11th November 1880.

Ned is reported to have said "SUCH IS LIFE" as his last words.

Ned was buried in an unmarked grave at the Old Melbourne Gaol, his remains were later reburied at Pentridge Prison.



DEATH MASK

After Ned Kelly was hung in the OLD MELBOURNE GOAL they would use plaster to make a mask of the face and skull.

One of the several 'death masks' that were taken of Ned's head, was put on display on Bourke Street in Melbourne



ARMOUR

Ned's armour had a letter-box style helmet, his armour was constructed from Mouldboards (thick metal part off ploughs) .

Some of these parts were brought, some given to the gang and few were stolen.

The armour let the gang walk around unharmed from close range shootings. These suits made the members of the gang look larger, more intimidating some even say ghost like.

Ned's armour weighed 41.4kgs which is very heavy, only their arms and legs weren't covered with the armour.


Battery Drive

Please ask your friends, family & any farmers you know, if they have any old batteries they are willing to donate to Cavendish PS.




